

## THE LIAISON OF INDEPENDENT FILMMAKERS OF TORONTO (LIFT) ANNOUNCES A VISIT BY ANIMATOR STEVEN WOLOSHEN AUGUST 15 - 17, 2014

**Toronto, July 29, 2014**—Liaison of Independent Filmmakers of Toronto (LIFT) is pleased to announce that Montréal filmmaker **Steven Woloshen** will be joining us in Toronto from **August 15 - 17, 2014** to present a screening of his films, teach a hands-on workshop and lead a master class. Woloshen has been making hand-made animated films for the last 30 years—primarily on 35mm film—using paints; scratching on film; and repurposing found footage. He takes found footage or black or clear leader and applies paints, scratches, tape or other translucent objects to the films, creating visual collages that completely reinvent themselves on the screen. His recent book, *Recipes for Reconstruction: The Cookbook for the Frugal Filmmaker* is now in its 3rd printing. In addition to his traditional analogue methods, Woloshen will be sharing how he has begun to incorporate High Definition video into his workflow.

On Friday August 15 at 8:00pm, Woloshen will be presenting The Mechanical Paradise, a screening of 16 of his films at CineCycle, 129 Spadina Avenue (down the alley). He will be showing most of his films on 35mm, including the award-winning *Camera Takes Five* and the Jutra nominated *Two Eastern Hair Lines*. The screening is \$5.00 for LIFT members, \$8.00 for non-members

On **Saturday August 16**, from **10:00am - 6:00pm**, Woloshen will be leading a hands-on workshop at LIFT, 1137 Dupont Street. This workshop will explore techniques of camera-less filmmaking such as direct ink/paint, sanding and bricolage with found film. Participants are encouraged to choose their own materials and tools, then scratch, paint and collage directly on the surface of clear leader, black leader or previously shot material. No prior experience is necessary. Advanced registration is required (416.588.6444). The workshop costs \$160 for LIFT members and \$180 for non-members, which includes all film materials.

Finally, on Sunday **August 17, 12:00pm - 4:00pm**, Woloshen will be leading a master class, focusing on combing old school analogue tools with digital processes at LIFT, 1137 Dupont Street. Woloshen will discuss new and radical strategies from his recent book on handmade filmmaking titled *Recipes for Reconstruction*. This master class will discuss traditional techniques of cameraless filmmaking in the High Def world, including scratching, painting and collage on film stock. No prior experience is necessary. There is no hands-on element to this class. Advanced registration is required (416.588.6444). The master class costs \$55 for LIFT members and \$75 for non-members.
