#### WORKSHOPS

As always we offered 180 workshops in the past year. 60 per season. But this year we added **14** new workshops, including: *Working with a Voice Coach, Contact Printing + Emulsion Manipulation, 35mm Filmmaking, Production Accounting, Film Law, and Virtual Reality Workflow.* 



#### JOSPEHINE MASSARELLA AWARD

2019 marked the first year we presented the Josephine Massarella Award to a female artist over 40 returning to their practice. The lucky recipient was long-time member Larissa Fan.

### Artists in Residence

- Aitziber Olaskoaga was the second resident of the BAICC Residencias Artísticas Internacionales de Creacion Cinematográfica, a collaboration between the (S8) Mostra Internacional de Cinema Periférico, LIFT, and Acción Cultural Española (AC/E).
- Steindorf and Kyle Williams (aka Blinn & Lambert) were the first residents in the 2019 edition of the Studio Immersion Program, supported by the Petman Foundation.
- Local Toronto-based filmmaker Andrew
  Lennox was the second resident in the 2019 edition of the Studio Immersion Program, supported by the Petman Foundation.
- **Manuela de Laborde** joined us from Mexico City, to work on completing Ficciones, a new film that she is making for the 66th annual International Short Film Festival Oberhausen in May.
- **Milja Viita** was the inaugural resident in a residency program for alumni of the Academy of Fine Arts of the University of the Arts Helsinki. This residency, supported by the Academy and the Saastamoinen Foundation.

### SEASONAL SCREENING SERIES

In 2019 we revived LIFT's long standing tradition of screening our members works with the Seasonal Screening Series at Niagara Custom Lab. Showcasing 19 films and highlighting Documentary, Experimental and Narrative works at Niagara Custom Lab.

### **COMMUNITY PROGRAMS**

For the second year in a row LIFT supported **Tout-Monde: Markham**. A commissioning project which sought to engage with the delicate, yet timely, discourse about encountering and representing the other. Six new works came out of the program in collaboration with Elegoa Cultural Productions and Varley Art Gallery.



#### LIFT FEATURETTE

Thanks to the generous support of our friends at Hollywood Suite we were able to produce a series of Artist Interviews and Featurette on LIFT'S place in the moving image community in Toronto. It featured interviews with both former and current members: John Greyson, Phil Hoffman, Sally Lee, Sofia Bohdanovic, Alexi Manis, Cole Forrest and Christina Zeidler.
