

LIFT ANNOUNCES FINNISH VISITING ARTIST NATALIA KOZIEŁ-KALLIOMÄKI

Toronto, September 19, 2023 (revised)—The Liaison of Independent Filmmakers of Toronto (LIFT) is pleased to announce that Natalia Kozieł-Kalliomäki has joined us from Helsinki, Finland as a visiting artist from September 1 to November 30, 2023 as the fourth resident in the residency program for alumni of the Academy of Fine Arts of the University of the Arts Helsinki. This residency, which started in 2019 as a partnership between the Academy and the Saastamoinen Foundation, is designed to provide international opportunities for alumni in the form of residency grants to prestigious residencies in New York, Maastricht, London and Toronto.

Natalia Kozieł-Kalliomäki (b. 1987, Bydgoszcz, Poland) is based in Helsinki, Finland. She completed a first MA in painting at Academy of Fine Arts in Gdańsk and completed an MA at the University of the Arts in Helsinki in printmaking. She has been showing her works of printmaking and expanded cinema internationally in exhibitions and festivals, such as Alert Live Art Festival, Hanko Film Festival, Wejherowo palace, and the Huuto Gallery; Helsinki. http://www.nataliakoziel.pl

Kozieł-Kalliomäki will be using the time and resources at LIFT to collect 16mm footage material of Toronto and combine it with geometrical pop-up paper animation to create an expanded space installation with multi-sensory experiences and a strong synesthetic feeling. The abstract image will be combined with concrete depictions of the city architecture. Through looping, copying and reexposures, she will create actions that engage many senses, committed as she is to exploring synaesthesia and the connections between different sensory experiences.

"It is not accidental that film is also called, 'print'. That's why, as an artist working at the intersection of expanded printmaking and film, I am deeply inspired by the opportunity to participate in this residency at LIFT to create a new work that explores the relationship between these two mediums. I will work under the slogan "taking spaces", as I believe that photochemical film is the only feature of human kind that can be immortal and relocate space and allow space to travel. The power of analogue film is to bring people together, to make them build and dream the same dream jointly, to create and experience a unique artistic object in a unique situation. To resurrect this lost collective joy of moving images is the purpose of my project. I hope to evoke a sense of wonder and curiosity in the viewer, and to invite them to engage with the film on a deeper, more intuitive level."
